DEFINITIONS

Sub-Junior: any person who has not reached his or her fourteenth birthday.

Junior: any person who has not reached his or her eighteenth birthday.

Triple Sub: any person between the ages of eighteen and thirty nine.

Sub-Sub-Senior: any person who has reached his or her fortieth birthday.

Sub-Senior: any person who has reached his or her fiftieth birthday.

Senior: any person who has reached his or her sixtieth birthday

Veteran: any person who has reached his or her seventieth birthday.

Senior Veteran: any person who has reached his or her eightieth birthday.

NOTES

1. No contestant shall be eligible for more than one concurrent event based on age.
2. A contestant entering a concurrent event based on age must shoot in the event for which he or she is qualified. (e.g., a senior may not enter as a sub-senior)
3. The contestant's age on November 1, 2010 shall determine his or her eligibility to enter events based on age for the entire shooting year. [NSSA Rule: Section II-C-4-a]
4. Parent and Child entries can be either parent of any child who is of junior or sub-junior eligibility.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. This shoot is registered with, and will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the National Skeet Shooting Association (NSSA) and the Massachusetts Skeet Shooting Association (MSSA).
2. Flight times and shooting fields will be rotated to ensure fairness to all shooters. All events will be shot 100 targets per field.
3. Classification will be based on 2010 NSSA rules. It is the shooters responsibility to present a Classification Card that contains a complete and accurate record of scores, averages, & classes.
4. Preference in squadding reservations will be given to shooters of all four guns, and their requests for reservations must not be postmarked earlier than July 16, 2010. No requests for reservations will be processed until July 23, 2010, when they will be processed by order of postmark date. Reservations will only be accepted by mail. A deposit of \$ 50.00 per shooter is required. Five person squads **must** send their reservation requests in the same envelope indicating squadding order. The deposit is non-refundable unless notification of cancellation is received by shoot management on or before July 31, 2010. After July 31st, \$25.00 will be withheld from any cancellation refund request to cover referee fees. (per order of Zone 1 Directors).
5. The club will provide shoot-off targets at its own expense, but shoot-off ammunition will be at the shooters' expense.
6. At all Zone One Championship shoots, shoot-off doubles shall be shot under "NSSA Doubles Rules" and all malfunction rules shall be suspended. All Class places will be shot off.
7. At all Zone One Championship shoots, shoot-offs for two-man and five-man team events will be shot off by Doubles from stations 3-4-5, Miss and Out by station and shall be shot off subsequent to the gauge event.
8. Awards for the Doubles, 12 and 20 gauge events will be presented on Saturday evening. 28, 410 and High Over All awards can be mailed.
9. Winnings for the Doubles, 12 and 20 gauge events will be paid off the following morning. Winnings for the 28, 410 and High Over All events will be mailed on or before the Friday following the shoot.
10. The Minute Man Sportsman's Club will be open for practice on Wednesday and Thursday before the shoot and during the shoot if possible. Practice will be at current club price at time of entry. Shoot registration will open at 2:00 PM on Thursday. Campers requiring electricity & water: \$12.00 per day charge - call for reservation.
11. Contestants and spectators assume all risks of theft and/or accidents.
12. Eye and ear protection is mandatory on or near the fields.
13. "Fees" not included in the "Entry Fee" for events 1-5 are as follows:
DAILY FEES per 100 Targets: NSSA:\$3.00 - MSSA:\$2.00 - Zone 1:\$1.00
14. The entire content of this program was written and approved by the Zone One Directors.
15. Zone One Directors and Minute Man Sportsman's Club reserve the right to suspend or alter the program if conditions so warrant, and to refuse entry, or, cause the withdrawal of any shooter for any reason they deem proper.
